The Latest from Loretta...

I am feeling invigorated! In the past three weeks I attended two conferences where stigma was the talk. Yes, stigma! Very exciting!

In San Francisco I attended the 7th International *Together Against Stigma: Each Mind Matters* conference. Over 850 people attended this gathering of the world's most influential leaders on the stigma associated with mental illness, in the areas of research, policy and advocacy. This was the largest of the six previous events, and the first to take place in the US. A recurring theme throughout the conference was the recognition of stigma as a social justice issue: when people are stigmatized they are not valued equally and consequently excluded socially. This rings true for *all* stigmatized identities, and is the focus of the work we do.

Last week, at the Eastern Psychological Association's Annual Conference in Philadelphia I attended several symposiums about stigma that covered many different identities: sexual orientation, weight, age, race, gender, mental illness and disease. One discussion delved deeper: how stigma affects minorities and their study of STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) academic disciplines. It was wonderful to see such a broad range of areas being addressed!

The most exciting observation was the people that I spoke with at both events shared our interest in building collaborations with other groups and organizations outside of the identity that they represent to create social change!

- Dr. Dana Beyer is a retired eye surgeon who was a candidate for the Maryland state Senate in 2014. She is currently Executive Director of Gender Rights Maryland, the state's trans political organization that worked the gender identity bill to passage in 2014. In 2009 she helped organize and co-authored The Dallas Principles. She led the coalitions that passed the Baltimore, Howard and Montgomery County gender identity anti-discrimination laws, and defended the Montgomery County law against national right-wing forces in 2008. She was on the workgroup at the Washington Psychiatric Society that wrote the Gender Dysphoria text for the DSM 5, declassifying being transgender as a mental disorder. She was the first out trans graduate of the Senior Executive Program in State and Local Government at Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government. Read more.
